John H. Krystal, MD



Professor of Clinical Pharmacology Chairman, Department of Psychiatry

Dr. Krystal is the Robert L. McNeil, Jr., Professor of Clinical Pharmacology and Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry, Yale University School of Medicine and the VA Connecticut Healthcare System. He is a graduate of the University of Chicago, Yale University School of Medicine, and the Yale Department of Psychiatry Residency Training Program. He has published over 300 papers and chapters on the neurobiology and treatment of alcoholism, schizophrenia, and post-traumatic stress disorder. In this work, he is best known for studies of the contributions of amino acid neurotransmission to behavior, cognition, psychopathology, and treatment. His research program unites psychopharmacology, neuroimaging, and molecular genetics. He is principal investigator of the NIAAA Center for the Translational Neuroscience of Alcoholism, VA Alcohol Research Center, and Clinical Neuroscience Division of the VA National Center for PTSD. Dr. Krystal received the Joel Elkes Award of the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology (ACNP), the Han Jönas Weitbrecht Scientific Award from Bayer, the Danielli and Presidents Awards from the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies, Most Highly Cited Investigator Award from Thomson-ISI, APIRE/Kempf Fund Award of the American Psychiatric Association, and other awards. He is Chairman of the NIMH Board of Scientific Counselors (2004-2007). He also serves on the NARSAD Scientific Advisory Board and the boards of directors of the ACNP and the Research Society on Alcoholism. He was a managing editor for the journal, Psychopharmacology (1999-2006) and is currently editor of Biological Psychiatry.
